

The regular meeting of the Clearfield County Commissioners was held on Tuesday, September 11, 2018 with Chair Sobel conducting the meeting. The following were in attendance: Commissioners Scotto and McCracken; Kim Kesner, Solicitor; Tom Adamson, Controller; Bill & Pam Gable and Brody Lanich, Representing Blessings from the Battle; Jeff Corcino, Progress/Courier; Jessica Shirey, gantdaily.com; Yvonne Lehman, Radio WOKW; Lisa McFadden, Chief Clerk.

Minutes of the previous meeting of August 28, 2018 were approved by motion of Commissioner McCracken, seconded by Commissioner Scotto; motion carried unanimously.

Controller Adamson presented the following bills for approval: General Fund, \$826,812.27; Liquid Fuels Fund, \$14,625.96; Hazardous Materials Fund, \$284.06; Children Youth Services Fund, \$21,704.43; Domestic Relations Fund, \$65,517.92. Approval of the bills by Scotto, seconded by Commissioner McCracken; motion carried unanimously.

Chair Sobel introduced Pam and Bill Gable and Brody Lanich representing Blessings from the Battle. Mrs. Gable explained that Blessings from the Battle is a 5013C non-profit organization that was formed after her grandson Brody was diagnosed at five with cancer. Mrs. Gable

explained that during Brody's treatment their families were blessed with so much community support whether it was financial, moral, child and pet care, home care that they want to give back to the community so they formed the organization to help other children and families in the community that are battling an illness. On September 15, they will host a Masquerade Ball at the Clearfield/Curwensville Country Club as a fundraiser. The Commissioners were honored to Proclaim - September 15, 2018 as Blessings from the Battle Day in Clearfield County by motion of Commissioner McCracken, seconded by Commissioner Scotto; motion carried unanimously.

Purchase of Service Agreements were approved for Pentz Run Youth Services, Inc. and Keystone Adolescent Center, Inc. by motion of Commissioner Scotto, seconded by Commissioner McCracken; motion carried unanimously.

Liquid Fuel allocations were approved for the following: Grampian Borough, \$3,000; Osceola Mills Borough, \$3317.71; Bigler Township, \$3629.43; Morris Township, \$4,510.89 by motion of Commissioner Scotto, seconded by Commissioner McCracken; motion carried unanimously. Also an Liquid Fuel allocation was approved for Mahaffey Borough in the amount of \$3,000 by motion of Commissioner McCracken, seconded by Commissioner Scotto; Chair Sobel abstained due to conflict; motion carried.

Solicitors Report – None

Chair Sobel reminded everyone that today is the 17th Anniversary of 9/11/01 and asked that Clearfield County residents keep this in mind and the freedom this Country has and to thank Law Enforcement and First Responders that the service and sacrifice that they make.

Chair Sobel spoke about the flooding that has been caused by all of the rain that began on Saturday. As reported by Joe Bigar, County EMA director several areas with significant flooding in the County are Mahaffey, Osceola, Chester Hill, Philipsburg, Clearfield and Coalport. The EMA Staff and many volunteer first responders have been out overnight and many hours pumping basements and monitoring flooded roads and highways.
